Local security guide - Logan Central QLD 4114 - Logan, City of Logan

About Logan Central

Logan Central is about 23 km south of the Brisbane CBD.

Logan Central is the administrative heart of the City of Logan, south of Brisbane, with the council offices, Logan Central Plaza and Woodridge station nearby, surrounded by established residential streets. The Queensland Police Service recorded 8,673 offences against the person and property in the Logan Central police division in 2025-26, up from 8,074 the year before and the second-highest count in greater Brisbane. The largest groups were assault (1,365), property damage (994) and theft from vehicles (929), and there were 538 cases of unlawful use of a motor vehicle, Queensland's term for car theft.

Housing and local context

Housing stock: Low-set brick and weatherboard houses from the 1970s and 1980s, townhouses and unit complexes.

Logan Central grew with Logan's rapid expansion in the 1970s and 1980s, and its streets are lined with low-set brick and weatherboard homes on generous blocks, along with townhouse and unit complexes. It is one of the most culturally diverse areas in Queensland. Homes often have a carport or open driveway rather than a lock-up garage, and many are rented, so security upgrades may need the owner's agreement.

Common security concerns in Logan Central

- Theft from cars and car theft from open driveways and carports
- Property damage to homes, cars and fences
- Rented homes where security upgrades need the owner's agreement

Local tip: Put the car behind a locked gate

Theft from vehicles and car theft are both common across the Logan Central division, with 929 and 538 offences last year. Park inside a garage or behind a locked gate where you can, keep keys in a drawer away from doors and windows, and cover the driveway with a sensor light and a camera that records at night. Leaving a car unlocked for just a minute is how many thefts start.

Before you hire: checklist

- Look up the licence number on the relevant state regulator register and confirm it is current.
- Check the ABN on the Australian Business Register (abr.business.gov.au).
- Hardwired 240V work needs a licensed electrician; in-wall data cabling needs an ACMA-registered cabler.
- For guards and patrols, confirm both the firm licence and each attending officer's licence.
- Get at least three written quotes listing camera models, recorder storage and warranty.
- Aim cameras at your own property and consider disabling audio on cameras facing shared areas.
