Local security guide - Penrith NSW 2750 - Outer west Sydney, City of Penrith

About Penrith

Penrith is about 50 km west of the Sydney CBD.

Penrith is the regional centre of Sydney's outer west on the Nepean River at the foot of the Blue Mountains, with Westfield Penrith, the High Street shops and a growing number of apartments near the station. BOCSAR recorded 4,090 criminal incidents in Penrith in the year to June 2026 (not counting transport fines and breaches of bail or court orders), up from 3,842 the year before. Theft from shops (750), malicious damage (356) and theft from motor vehicles (182) were among the largest groups.

Housing and local context

Housing stock: Brick and fibro houses from the 1950s to 1980s, villas and townhouses, apartments near the station and the river.

Penrith's older streets have brick and fibro houses on generous blocks, often with a carport, shed and room for a trailer or caravan down the side, while townhouses, villas and apartments have been built closer to the station, the High Street and the river. The city centre has shops, offices and a TAFE and university presence nearby, and industrial estates sit on the edges of the suburb. Security needs range from driveway cameras and monitored alarms for homes to patrols for business sites.

Common security concerns in Penrith

- Tools and equipment in utes and trailers parked in driveways
- Theft from shops and cars around Westfield Penrith and the High Street
- Industrial and trade sites on the edge of the suburb after hours

Local tip: Lock up the work ute and trailer

Plenty of Penrith households park a work ute, trailer or boat in the driveway, and tools left in a ute tray or toolbox overnight are an easy target. Bring tools inside or into a locked garage, fit a proper lock to the toolbox, use a hitch or wheel lock on trailers, and cover the driveway with a camera and sensor light.

Before you hire: checklist

- Look up the licence number on the relevant state regulator register and confirm it is current.
- Check the ABN on the Australian Business Register (abr.business.gov.au).
- Hardwired 240V work needs a licensed electrician; in-wall data cabling needs an ACMA-registered cabler.
- For guards and patrols, confirm both the firm licence and each attending officer's licence.
- Get at least three written quotes listing camera models, recorder storage and warranty.
- Aim cameras at your own property and consider disabling audio on cameras facing shared areas.
